



2009-2010 Fact Sheet

1. What are the 2010 Priority Areas for the Florida Breast Cancer Foundation?

This year's designated Education grant theme is: Education that Empowers Women and Men to Play an Active Role in Breast Health. The Foundation is particularly interested in reviewing proposals that target: Individuals with Language and Cultural Barriers; Individuals who Live in Underserved Areas; and Interventions that Engage Health Care Professionals.

2. What are the Important Dates:

February 24, 2010	Optional Grant Workshop Conference Call
March 1, 2010	Announcement of RFP
May 28, 2010	Application due (must be postmarked no later than this date)
August 2, 2010	Announcement of grant award recipients
September 1, 2010	Grant cycle begins
March 30, 2010	Six month progress report due
August 31, 2011	End of grant cycle
October 31, 2011	Final Report Due

3. Do we qualify for a FBCF Education Grant?

Only Florida non-profit community based organizations with a 501(c)3 status are eligible to apply for funding.

4. Does the Project have to be specific to breast cancer?

Yes, the Project must be specific to breast health and/or breast cancer; e.g. if a project is a combined breast and cervical cancer project, funding may only be requested for the breast cancer portion.

5. Do all services have to be provided in the state of Florida?

Yes, all services must be provided in the state of Florida.

6. Are there any restrictions on the type of programs to be funded?

Yes, funding is **NOT** available for screening or treatment programs.

7. How is the budget divided:

- Indirect costs, if applicable, should be no more than 15% of direct costs.

- Equipment costs, if applicable, may not exceed 30% of direct costs and should be used exclusively on this project.
- Salaries, if requested, are for personnel related to this project only and not for general work of any employees.

8. Are there any reasons for the application to be delayed or denied?

Failure to stay within page limitations as stated in the RFP will result in delayed processing and/or refusal of the application

9. Can organizations submit more than one grant proposal?

Yes, organizations may submit more than one grant proposal.

10. How do I submit a grant application to the FBCF?

All grant applications must be submitted in the following **TWO** forms:

Hardcopy and Electronic.

1. Hardcopy Submission: When submitting hardcopy of the grant, please mail the grant application and all required documents together to the following address with a postmark date no later than May 28, 2010.

- Submit ten (10) hardcopies of each application.
- Applications should be bound by staples only.
- Please no spiral bound materials.
- Fax copies will not be accepted.

2. Electronic Submission: When submitting the grant application electronically, please email the proposal to Jessica Parker-Kerr at e-mail address:

Important: Failure to meet the requested criteria will automatically exclude the grant application from being considered for review and hence, funding. Any applications postmarked after the deadline of May 28, 2010 will **NOT** be considered.
